

#### Recycling

Through education and action we can help reduce, recycle and re-purpose to build a brighter future for every Aussie kid.

As part of our Sustainability efforts we are participating in the cans and bottle recycling program. Every second Friday, Envirobank will collect our full bags and leave us with new ones. Please send your children to the front office to collect a new bag.

We have also partnered with Wondersoft to help reduce soft plastic waste.



#### Did you know?

In Australia, only 18%\* of plastic packaging is recycled - which is why Wonde recycling rewards was created. This is a fun and easy program for Aussie schools to recycle bread bags that might otherwise go to landfill and earn rewards points in the process.

Students are asked to bring in bread bags (any brand, does not have to be Wondersoft) and place them in a box that will be kept in the front office.

Once collected, Wonder is going to turn the plastic into wonderful things like school play equipment. All registered schools can earn reward points to spend on new sports equipment, simply by collecting the bread bags and sending them to Wondersoft.

#### **Colour Spactacular**

## YEAR 3

Year 3 had a visit from Red Cross on Monday of Week 8 and were taught how to use a breathing exercise to stay calm when feeling stressed or anxious. They also discussed what important items should go in an emergency kit. The children were all given a pillowcase each, which they decorated with the important items they felt they would need in case of an emergency. Things like a mobile phone and portable charger, water, food, medicine, first aid kit and toiletries were all mentioned.

Year 3 decided by majority vote to explore Ukraine, as part of our Harmony Day celebration. The children researched information about their cultural dress, music, food, flag, geography, religion and art. Jayden and Evie presented the Year 3 findings at Assembly in Week 8.

Year 3 have been exploring 'time', what it is, how it works and where we would see evidence of time. The children had the option to work in groups or individually. From their brainstorming they covered that time can be seen as: past, present and future; digital and analogue, A.M. means morning and P.M. means afternoon, the little hand on a clock means the hour hand and the long hand on a clock means the minute hand.

Lastly, the class have been learning about the Parable of the Lost Son in Christian Studies. They have made their own sequencing cards for the parable based on their understanding of the story. They were expected to write a sentence on each card and draw a picture to match.







#### **Allergy Aware**

Good Shepherd Lutheran College is committed to providing a safe learning environment for all our students and in particular to minimise the risk of allergen exposure. It is our policy to provide, as far as practicable, a safe and supportive environment in which students at risk of allergies can participate equally in all aspects of the student's schooling; to raise awareness about allergies, to engage with parents/carers of each student at risk of allergies when assessing risks and developing risk minimisation strategies for the student; and to ensure that staff have knowledge about allergies, anaphylaxis and the College's guidelines and procedures in responding to an anaphylactic reaction.


Given the number of foods to which a student may be allergic to, it is not possible to remove all allergens. It is better for the College community to become aware of the risks associated with allergies and for the College to implement practical, age appropriate strategies to minimise exposure to known allergens. For this reason, we do not promote that we either 'ban nuts' or are 'nut-free'. Promoting a College as 'nut-free' is not recommended for the following reasons:

- It is impractical to implement and enforce;
  - There is no evidence of effectiveness;
  - It does not encourage the development of strategies for avoidance in the wider College community; and
  - It may encourage complacency about risk minimisation strategies (for teachers, students and parents/carers) if a food is banned.

Whilst we do not claim to be 'nut-free', minimising exposure to particular foods such as peanuts and tree nuts can reduce the level of risk. This can include removing nut spreads and products containing nuts from the College canteen, but does not include removing products that 'may contain traces' of peanuts or tree nuts. We request that parents/carers of classmates of a young students (ELC-5) do not include nut spreads in sandwiches or products containing nuts in their lunch box
