

















GRIP Leadership Conference


Year 8 and 10 Mathematics



Year 8 students were involved with measurement - finding the area of parallelograms, kites and circles, which they presented on the class whiteboards.












Year 10 Science












































































Celebrating 25 Years

International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme

The Dry has arrived here in The Top End. There is a notable change in the humidity and our outdoor assemblies are far more pleasant. In terms of what is occurring inside our classrooms, students have all worked through at least one Unit of Inquiry and are at least midway through another.



Teachers are beginning to plan for our **Semester 1 Academic Reports** published at the end of Term 2. Year 10

students should be well into the research and creation component of their Personal Project and Year 6 and 7 students are gearing up for their **annual Spelling Bee**. Many teachers have already undertaken intensive International Baccalaureate professional development courses this year in relation to teaching and learning within

the Middle Years Programme. NAPLAN is over for another year; results will be available soon. There is some news I would like to address here in more detail:

MYP Semester 1 Academic Report

This Semester 1 Report heralds a revised format. The new format is the result of teacher, student and parent feedback from the previous year. The new format is designed to be more reader-friendly. It is important to note that the report is a summation of student progress through the semester. It is not the only way student progress is shared. Ongoing achievement grades and written feedback for subject assessments (available through our online

learning management system, SEQTA) is also a valuable source of ongoing reporting throughout the year. Of course, arranging contact with individual teachers when there are particular learning issues can also provide useful and immediate feedback. **Please let me know what you think of the new report format when it is published toward the end of this term.**



The National Assessment Program (NAP) Science Literacy Study is an online test that informs schools, education ministers and the community about the levels of achievement in science literacy among students across Australia. This year some of our Year 6 students will be participating during Week 5 of Term 2. This is a small group of 20 students selected at random by the government. Those selected students and their parents will be contacted separately.



Please be reminded that every lunchtime our IT technicians are available to assist students with their tech issues. Check with your child if there are any issues involving their laptop, apps, email access, internet connectivity, etc. Encourage them to get the issue resolved immediately at the Tech Foyer at lunchtime. Teaching and learning using personal laptops is a sizable part of every day and we do not want any student to miss out on learning due to personal device tech problems.

Learning Area Spotlight

Most days I make time to walk around our Middle School. I get to see what's happening with teaching and learning across our Learning Areas. Every day there are quality teaching and learning moments occurring.
















MYP Learning Area Spotlight - Design

Year 9 Design - Materials

Across two Materials classes, Year 9 students have been tasked to create functional stools (zaishus) and a textiles bag, that communicate a message of community and change.

Students used Criteria A and B to investigate the origins of the Zaishu and analysed existing similar products. They drafted and refined design options, justifying their choice

in the design they believe to be most suitable for production.

Workshop skills have been built through a number of tasks and experiments, including the use of a variety of hand tools, power tools, workshop machinery and a variety of decorating techniques. Student projects will be evaluated through peer surveys and feedback in the coming weeks.

Year 8 Digital Design

Year 8 Digital Design students surveyed peers to justify choosing only one design to make as a solution to a design problem based on the gaming industry. Criteria B in MYP 4 Design is about developing skills and justifying your decisions so you can create a relevant solution. Students developed skills by designing three characters using tools and filters of Adobe Photoshop. They surveyed peers, collated data, created graphs to represent their findings and summarised data before choosing a final design to animate.

Animations will be created as part of Criteria C where students construct a logical plan, demonstrate technical skills, follow the plan and list changes made to the plan. We look forward to seeing their final solutions and journals that back up their learning journey.

MYP Learning Area Spotlight - Design (continued)

Year 8 Textiles

Year 8 Textiles' students are **developing knowledge and skills** in a number of areas, including **design development, machine sewing and hand sewing**. With a focus on **changing technologies**, and imagining that they have been employed by Officeworks, students have been tasked to design and create functional laptop sleeves.

They have developed skills by creating and analysing three design options and selecting and justifying their best design. Through a number of practical tasks, including learning how to thread and operate a sewing machine, practicing measuring, cutting, pinning and ironing, students are building on transferrable and life-long knowledge and skills.





Year 7 Textiles

Students are imagining that they have been employed by Sheridan, to design and create a range of tea towels that communicate relationships. They have used Criteria A to investigate and analyse existing products, with a focus on using the ACCESS FM design framework throughout.

Further moving through the design process in Criteria B, students have drafted, refined and justified design options. Through a range of practical tasks, students have now begun producing their tea towels. This has required the acquisition of skills in measuring and cutting, pinning, ironing, hand sewing and machine sewing. We are excited to see students complete and evaluate their products as the term wraps up.

Language and Literature

Our Year 6 and 7 Language and Literature students have been engaging with the concepts of *perspective* and *communication* in their classes. **Units of Inquiry are valuable guides to develop the learning journey of our students**. SCHULEN: PARTNER DER ZUKUNFT (PASCH)" INITIATIVE

Good Shepherd held an extraordinary assembly at the Howard Springs Campus on Friday 12 May. Distinguished guests acknowledged the achievement of the College, presented Diplomas to students and acknowledged our current Diploma students: Mr Hoch - Head of Culture and Press Section of the German Embassy in Canberra and Mr Gruja - German Language Advisor for Australia for the Central Office for Schools Abroad of the Federal Office for Foreign Affairs.

The "Schools: Partners for the Future" (PASCH) initiative was launched in February 2008 by Germany's Federal Foreign Office. PASCH is coordinated by the Federal Foreign Office and implemented in cooperation with the Central Agency for Schools Abroad (ZfA), the Goethe-Institut, the German Academic Exchange Service and the Educational Exchange Service of the Standing Conference of the Ministers of Education and Cultural Affairs of the Federal States in the Federal Republic of Germany.

Good Shepherd is a PASCH School; a distinction given by the Federal Government of Germany to schools with outstanding German language programs and achievements. It is the first and only school in the NT and only the fourth school in Australia to be invited to join the network of more than 1500 partner schools worldwide. The objective of this partnership is to promote German language education in schools, intercultural meetings and the development of an international learning community.

As part of the PASCH network our students and teachers will receive excellent teaching resources, scholarships to Germany for top students, study-abroad programs, professional development for teachers in Germany, access to projects, competitions and many other events.






Year 11 Music


