







Year 8 Science Students ExCELL


Here are some amazing cell models, created by Mrs Neilsen's Year 8 Science students. Well done everyone, terrific work. This is on another 'cellular level'.















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
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


ExCELLent Year 8 Science Students

Good Relationships

Everybody knows that good relationships are important in a healthy life. Many would even know that healthy relationships are an important part of our wellbeing, perhaps including words like 'connectedness' and 'belonging' to describe what good relationships are like....but what does it actually mean to be connected and why is it important? We would all say that good relationships, being connected and feeling like we belong, make us feel good, loved, secure, cared for, protected and supported, and good relationships do all these things...but their impact is much deeper.

Being connected, and more specifically believing we are connected to others is one of the three Basic Psychological Needs that underpin human mental health and positive psychological growth. The other two needs are autonomy (having a personally meaningful reason for the things we do in life) and competence (believing that we can have an influence in our lives). When all three of these needs are in place, we are



naturally motivated to learn and grow but without any one of them we begin to become dependent on the influence of others. Not having our Basic Psychological Needs met can make us feel helpless, hopeless and can lead ultimately to depression...serious stuff.

Feeling connected in healthy relationships is the foundation upon which our mental health is built. They support our sense of *autonomy* by valuing our personal identity, strengths, values and passions which gives us confidence and trust in those around us. We are encouraged to be ourselves in healthy relationships and we are valued for who we are, and this can give us a bigger sense of purpose in life.

Healthy relationships also encourage our sense of *competence* by providing us with the encouragement and security to take risks (necessary for growth) and the support to overcome challenges when we encounter them. We are valued and safe even when we fail.

Yes, relationships make us feel good, but they are so much more. They are the safe, loving, caring, supportive and forgiving places in which we explore, learn about and practice being who we are, and who we can become.

Approaches to Learning Skills

The principle focus from our Three-way Conferences for all students, is centred around the 'approaches to learning' skills; often referred to in classrooms as the ATL's in the MYP.

Sometimes these are called the **21st-century skills** or the soft skills. They are the skills that are needed across all disciplines whose development is **essential in building independent and self-directed learners** who can achieve success beyond the bounds of the classroom.

We categorise the ATL skills into 5 key areas:

- Communication skills: such as reading, writing, using language, and interacting with others effectively.
- Social skills: such as collaboration;
- **Self-management skills:** such as organisation, time management, affective skills including emotional management and reflective skills;
- Research skills: which includes both information and media literacy;
- Thinking skills: which includes both critical and creative thinking as well as the ability to transfer that thinking from one context to another and between disciplines or ideas.

The **end of Term 1** is a perfect time for students to intentionally activate their reflection skills to consider the effectiveness of their learning approach and decision making, so that they can start Term 2 with a clear direction and intention.

To do this, **students can reflect on their goals** from the beginning of term to identify the specific actions they have taken to support themselves in achieving these goals, identify barriers and challenges to address, and to identify the 'what next?' in their journey to success. **Discussing this with family members, peers and teachers** all supports their commitment, determination, and perseverance towards achievement.

I wish all students a relaxing break so that they may refresh, refocus, and return with enthusiasm and optimism towards the second half of semester.

Well done Emily, this is an incredible accomplishment. Wishing you all the very best for your future studies - may all your dreams and artistic endeavours come true!



DSD I is the preliminary stage to the DSD II, which follows in the upper level and serves as proof of language proficiency for admission to German universities.




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Updated College App


