



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

We have finished our learning journey for the transdisciplinary theme - How We Organise with the central idea – Economies are dependent on the exchange of goods and services. Here are some of the students' reflections:

I have learned a lot now about the economy, services, and goods.

- I liked it when we used the shops because I learned more about the profits and money.
- I've learned how to use a service and how to count money.
- I have learned much more about money and I have also learned more about economies.
- I have learned that a debit card is better than credit cards, that credit cards use the bank's money, not yours.
- I learned that you could use mathematics in money and services.

The mathematical journey has continued with exploring and building knowledge about different strands of mathematics; how addition and subtraction, multiplication and division are related; building fast math facts; reflecting on telling the time with increasing accuracy; money and why it is important to understand taking and giving change.

Through the inquiry into procedure texts, students learned how important these can be when setting up businesses. They can help you to let your staff know what to do, you could create a business of writing procedure texts, and how to display goods and services to their best advantage so that the economy is alive and well through the exchange of goods and services.




