Primary Years Programme

Transdisciplinary Themes and Learning Area Subjects

The transdisciplinary themes provide the context for schools to frame a whole-school programme of inquiry, which is a cornerstone of the PYP pedagogy and its flexible framework. The programme of inquiry articulates how the six transdisciplinary themes will be explored across the different age groups. It provides students in the early and primary years with the opportunity to experience a coherent and balanced curriculum.

The programme of inquiry fosters students' development of subject knowledge, skills, conceptual understandings and dispositions. When the teaching team collaboratively plans each unit in the programme of inquiry to identify significant, relevant, challenging and engaging central ideas for investigations, creative inquiries flourish.

Designed collaboratively, each school's programme of inquiry reflects the unique aspects of that school community—from its geography, to the needs and experience of its members and associated national curriculum requirements. Through the programme of inquiry, all learners—students, teachers, and members of the community—are researchers. They move from what they know through personal experience and prior knowledge into ways of seeing and knowing that may be new or unfamiliar to them. They locate and work with subject-specific knowledge and skills in relation to the transdisciplinary themes. They compare and contrast the subjects' respective methods, tools and approaches to generate theories that support their conceptual understandings of the transdisciplinary themes. Through the programme of inquiry, they understand the essential interconnectedness and interdependence of them-selves, other people and the planet.

Through curriculum learning area subjects, students learn to appreciate the "ways of knowing"—the modes of thought and communication associated with a subject. They develop, for example, understandings of the methodologies associated with thinking like a scientist, a historian or an artist (Gardner and Boix Mansilla 1999).

The transdisciplinary theme and central idea of a unit under investigation contextualize subject knowledge in the inquiry process. Fostering transdisciplinary understanding requires that teachers consider subjects in relational terms to each other—and to the theme—as opposed to in isolationist or oppositional terms (Giri 2002). The role of the teachers—classroom or specialist—is to support the creative reimagining of the subjects and to identify possibilities for combining them (Bernstein 2015) in context of the transdisciplinary themes.

Wellbeing Coordinator

As a parent I know too well that we ask our children how was school as soon as we see them after a jam-packed day. Most of the time I get the reply, 'ok mum' or 'I don't know' and occasionally I get 'I don't want to talk about it'. I am sure most of you can relate to this. Often the question 'How was school?' is a big question to process and it is hard for a child to sum it all up and give an answer. The website Raisingchildren.net.au has some useful tips that we can use when asking our children about school. I hope that these provide some ideas and tips on how to get an insight into the life of your child at school.

When your child first gets home from school in the afternoon, they'll probably be tired and hungry or thinking about other things. So, easing the transition from school or after-school activities to home can help your child feel more like talking.

It's best to avoid asking your child a lot of questions straight away – this can be overwhelming for your child. You can just let your child know that you're glad to see them, and talk about non-school topics for a while. Younger children will probably also like unpacking their bags and going through any notes before you ask about school.

Saving questions about homework for later on can also take the pressure off!

Every afternoon or evening will be different. Even if your child usually likes to share their day with you, there'll be days when they don't want to talk. Sometimes it's a matter of sensing your child's mood and picking the right moment. Some days there might not be a right moment at all, and that's OK.

Simple, positive and specific questions about parts of the day can get your child talking. It's good to use questions that invite more than a 'yes', 'no' or 'OK' response. For example:

- · What's the news from school today?
- · What was fun?
- · What did you like best at school today?
- · What does your classroom look like at the moment?
- · What did you do in class after recess?
- · Who did you hang out with today?
- · What subjects did you do today?
- \cdot What topics are you working on in science at the moment?


Year 5 – Rebekah Dettman

Equipment

Ninja style blender or similar

Ingredients

Frozen red or black grapes, handful Frozen mango, 2 handfuls Frozen raspberries, handful Frozen watermelon, 4-6 chunks Frozen passionfruit, 1-2 cubes Water, approx. 1 cup



Instructions

Put all ingredients in your blender and mix at high speed until combined, about a minute.

Adjust the amounts of the fruit according to your taste. If any ingredients are not frozen you will need less water. Always put a little less water than you think you need, and you can easily add more if too thick. The consistency should be such that you can spoon it out when it's done.

For something different, freeze it into icy poles after mixing.


