PYP - The Evaluation Process: Parents

It would be fantastic to hear from anyone in our school community who is willing to participate in answering some questions about our school and how we run the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme (IBPYP) at Leanyer Campus during our Evaluation visit in August 2022. If anyone in the school community could email me an expression of interest by the end of this term to rebecca.fletcher@ntschools.net, it would be greatly appreciated.

An important part of the Evaluation process is to complete a self-study with as many members of the school community as possible: The School Board, Leadership, Teaching staff, Parents, and Students. This process is to get opinions on the programme from the stakeholders by using the IB Standards and Practices as a guide and to record the evidence that this is what happens at our school. We do this by sharing information with parents and asking some follow up questions, for example:

- 1. What grade is your son or daughter currently in?
- 2. Before entering the Primary Years Programme, what was your knowledge of the IB?
- 3. Since entering, what is it now?

The visiting team from the IB will ask questions during a 30-minute chat regarding communication between the school and the parent community particularly in regards to the PYP: ways that the school demonstrates its commitment to the IB PYP; your understanding of the IB PYP through parent information sessions, newsletter articles, or other correspondence; how your child may be using the Learner Profile Attributes or the Approaches To Learning Skills.

Parents who are involved are asked to be honest, talk about the curriculum, and talk about any issues and challenges. This is also their chance to highlight the school's strengths and achievements.

There is an information fact sheet about the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme for parents available in the front office upon request, or I am always willing to answer your questions.





Learning Enrichment

We all know that people learn in different ways and have different learning styles. We are all unique and our differing interests, strengths and weaknesses demonstrate the beauty of diversity. There are a number of ways that information can be presented to students and various ways in which students are able to show us what they know. At Good Shepherd we endeavour to gain an understanding of how each of our students' learn best. Teachers and Learning Support Officers will gather information from various sources in an effort to understand your child's learning. Eg, classroom observations, standardised tests, informal assessments, teacher conferencing, surveys and informally getting to know your child.

The below graphic provides a pictorial representation of the many learning styles / intelligences that can be present in any one classroom at any time. Reference: Howard Gardner Multiple Intelligences.

In an effort to cater to this variety of learners, teachers employ a number of strategies to support learning:

- Universal Design for Learning
- Multi-sensory / Multi-modal forms of learning and assessment
- Differentiation

As an IB school the Learner Profile sets out the following traits:

Knowledgeable Inquirer

Risk Taker Balanced

Caring Reflective

Open Minded Thinker



These are the core of our work with engaging students as they reflect on their own learning styles. It is important that students are able to recognise their strengths and areas of difficulty, within the Learner Profile. From this understanding they are able to develop their own goals for learning.

In following newsletters, our team of Learning Enrichment / Support Teachers will unpack the meaning behind Universal Design for Learning; differentiation and what is meant by multi-sensory / multi-modal ways of learning and assessing. We look forward to further supporting the learning of our community as we engage with and form relationships with our students and their families to provide the best possible learning experience.

Mitchell Mott broke the 11 Year Old Boys 200m race with a time of 32.28s AND 800m race with a time of 3mins 11.70s.






